Islamic Studies Department Honors Hazrat Ali's (Ali Karram-Allah-Wajhahu) Legacy in Thought-Provoking Seminar

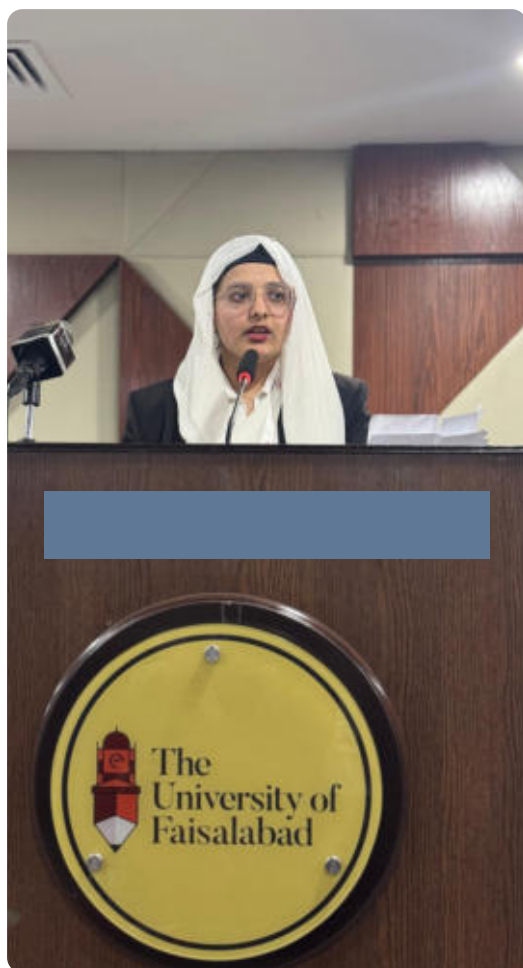

The keynote speaker, Ms Safia Jaffar, Lecturer, Department of Islamic Studies, delivered an insightful talk on the exemplary personality traits of Hazrat Ali Karram-Allah-Wajhahu. She highlighted his significant role as the cousin and son-in-law of the Holy Prophet Hazrat Muhammad (PBUH) and elaborated on how he was raised by the Holy Prophet (PBUH) and among the first to accept his teachings. Ms Safia emphasized Hazrat Ali's (Karram-Allah-Wajhahu) pivotal contributions during the early years of Islam, particularly during the period of severe persecution faced by the Muslims in Makkah. The seminar also featured students presenting Manqabat, Darood o Salam, and Dua, adding a spiritual and reverent atmosphere to the event.



Seminar on Hazrat Ali Karram-Allah-Wajhahu- His Da'wah Methodology and Practical Aspects

Department of Islamic Studies organized a seminar on "Hazrat Ali Karram-Allah-Wajhahu- His Da'wah Methodology and Practical Aspects". Prof Dr Matloob Ahmad, Dean Faculty of Arts and social sciences in his address told that Hazrat Ali Karram-Allah-Wajhahu was born in the Kaaba in Makkah, making his birth a unique event in Islamic history. He grew up in the household of the Holy Prophet Hazrat Muhammad (PBUH) and became one of the earliest converts to Islam.

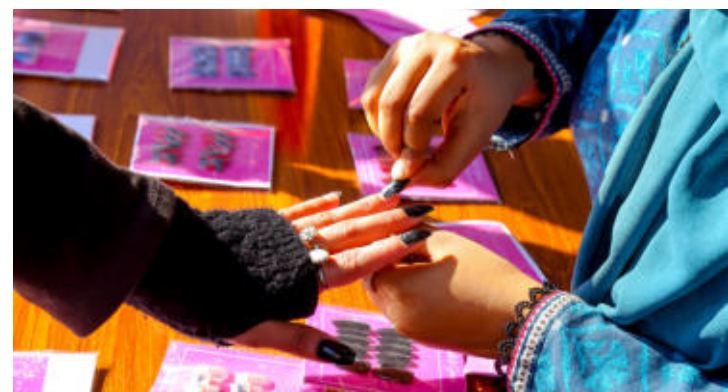

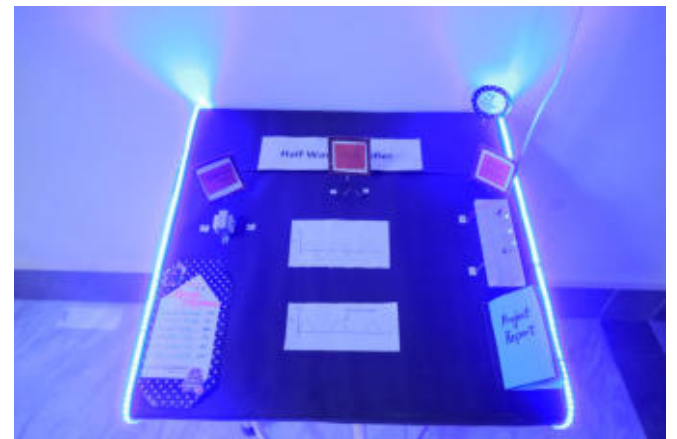
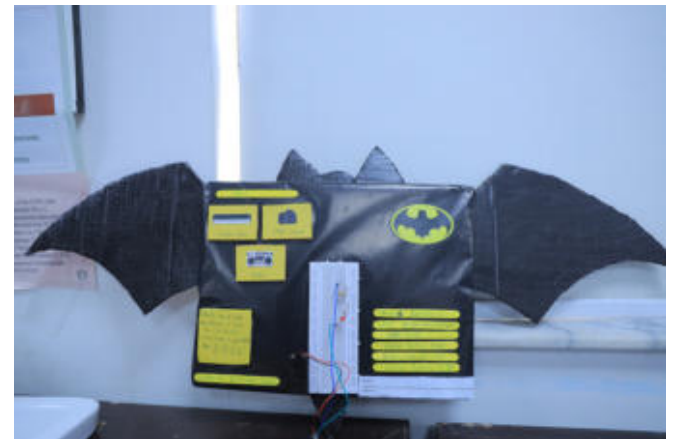
