

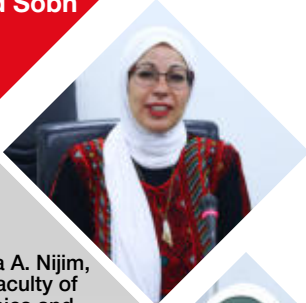

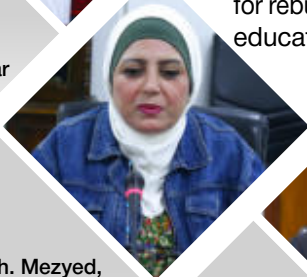

The University of Faisalabad had the honor of welcoming the delegation from Palestine and Gaza in a remarkable expression of brotherhood and compassion. Under facilitation of OIC-COMSTech, the delegation composed of Vice Chancellors and senior representatives of leading universities from Gaza-Palestine was on 7 days visit to Pakistan to explore mutual avenues of academic collaboration for rebuilding Gaza in the areas of higher education and health sectors.

It marked a significant step toward building academic and healthcare partnerships aimed at empowering Palestinian institutions and communities through education, research, and medical assistance.

The Palestinian delegation included Prof Dr Ayman Mahmoud Sobh, President of Al-Aqsa University Prof Dr Mr Salem A. Sabbah, President at University of Gaza, and Dr Darwish M.D. Aljakhlab, Dean,

External Affairs, Islamic University of Gaza; Mr Ibraheem A. A. Abu Rahaman, Dean of Student Affairs at Gaza University; Dr Monia Kh. Mezyed, Dean of Scientific Research at Israa University; and Prof Noha A. Nijim, Dean, Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences at Al-Azhar University, Gaza.

The delegation was received in the presence of Dr Muhammad Murtaza Noor, Focal Person and Coordinator at OIC-COMSTech, **Mr Muhammad Haider Amin**, Chairman Board of Governors, TUF; **Dr Zahida Maqbool**, Registrar, TUF; Prof Dr Akram Malik, Principal UMDC; and

the Deans of all faculties of TUF. The distinguished delegates shared their experiences and discussed the academic and healthcare challenges currently faced by Palestinian institutions amid the ongoing crisis. Mr Muhammad Haider Amin stated that TUF aims to help the people of Palestine by offering healthcare support

through the advanced medical training and facilities available at UMDC and Madinah Teaching Hospital. He announced that TUF would extend comprehensive assistance through research resources, digital libraries, while also offering opportunities for Palestinian students particularly those whose



medical education has been disrupted to continue their studies at The University of Faisalabad. Currently, the University is already hosting 19 Palestinian students enrolled in various disciplines, serving as a beacon of hope and educational continuity for the youth of Gaza. During the meeting, the Deans of TUF proposed practical solutions to extend academic and healthcare assistance to Gaza. They suggested initiating an online education program to support Palestinian students, and establishing working groups in coordination with

COMSTECH for prompt implementation. They also shared the idea of launching a digital telemedicine system to connect healthcare professionals in Gaza with UMDC's medical faculty, enabling continuous guidance, consultation, for the rehabilitation of affected brothers and sisters. The delegation also interacted with students and faculty members, sharing words of encouragement and appreciation for TUF's ongoing academic and humanitarian initiatives. The members of the delegation also visited the state-of-the-art Madinah

Teaching Hospital and the advanced laboratories of the University. As a gesture of friendship and sustainability, they also planted saplings in the University lawn, under the TUF Go Green Initiative.



REIMAGINING JUSTICE PAKISTAN HOSTS FIRST INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON Islamic Law and Human Rights in Capital Punishment



The University of Faisalabad in collaboration with Justice Project Pakistan, Green International University, and the University of Rawalpindi, hosted a landmark two-day International Conference on "Reimagining Justice: Harmonizing Islamic Law and International Human Rights Standards on Capital Punishment" from October 21–22, 2025.

This historic event marked Pakistan's first dedicated national forum on aligning Islamic jurisprudence with contemporary human

rights frameworks. It brought together renowned scholars, jurists, practitioners, and students to engage in informed dialogue on justice, reform, and human dignity. The conference opened with welcoming remarks by Prof Dr Aman Ullah Malik, Rector, The University of Faisalabad, a policy briefing by Barrister Sarah Belal, Executive Director, Justice Project Pakistan, and a keynote address by Prof Dr Muhammad Mushtaq Ahmad. Panel discussions explored a wide range of themes, including prisoners' rights,

mercy and evidentiary safeguards, and the treatment of mental illness in criminal responsibility.

Distinguished speakers included Justice (R) Khalil-ur-Rehman Ramday, Prof Dr Qibla Ayaz, Ms Ambika Satkunanathan, Prof Dr Stefaan Smis, Dr Mohammad Habbash, Dr Inam Ullah, Dr Sadiq Kakar, Mr Farooq Ahsan, Barrister Qasim Chowhan, Dr Roop Zainab Rana, Ms Denny LaBoeuf, and Ms Namra Gillani.

Conference themes

Sessions and papers were structured around six pillars

1. Islamic jurisprudence and the death penalty, classical and modern interpretations
2. Pakistan's legal, procedural, and policy trends on capital punishment
3. International human rights standards and fair-trial safeguards
4. Comparative case studies and reform pathways across Islamic jurisdictions
5. Protection of vulnerable groups, including juveniles, women, indigent defendants, and persons with mental illness
6. Advocacy, litigation, and community engagement strategies for measured reform

The Faculty of Law, TUF, played a central role in designing and delivering the program. Ms Amna Imdad and Ms Sadia Tanveer co-authored and presented a research paper titled "From Moratorium to Reform: Aligning Pakistan's Death Penalty Regime

with International Human Rights Standards." Ms Amna Imdad also served as Conference Secretary, while Ms Sadia Tanveer, an IMI-accredited mediator, coordinated abstracts, research, and media engagement. Faculty members Ms Jannat Shahzad, Ms

Naheed Ranjha, Ms Rida Zulfiqar, Ms Atiqa Saleem, and Dr Sohail Amjad were acknowledged for their outstanding support in conference execution.

Participants from universities across Pakistan—including GCU Faisalabad, GCU Women University Faisalabad, Faisalabad College of Law, University of Sindh, LUMS, Bahria University Islamabad, and NUST—joined the event, alongside TUF’s LLB and LLM scholars. The academic sessions were complemented by a Gala Dinner and Ghazal Night, fostering intellectual and cultural exchange. The closing ceremony was graced by Prof Dr Aman Ullah Malik, Prof Dr Muhammad Mushtaq Ahmad, Dr Attaullah

Khan Mahmood Watto, Prof Dr Sami-ur-Rahman, Rana Raza Ullah Khan (DIG Prisons, Punjab), Mr Sajid Baig (SP Prisons, Faisalabad), Dr Asif Khan, and Dr Sadiq Kakar. While addressing the participants Barrister Sarah Belal, Executive Director, Justice Project Pakistan expressed;

“Our aim is practical change. By aligning Islamic legal principles with international norms, we can reduce irreversible error, strengthen safeguards, and improve the administration of justice where life is at

stake,”

In his address Prof Dr Aman Ullah Malik, Rector, TUF said; “Pakistan can lead a thoughtful, text-grounded conversation on justice that protects life, dignity, and due process. This conference gathered diverse scholarship to identify reforms that are faithful to Islamic jurisprudence and responsive to today’s human rights standards,”

The 10th Academic Studies Congress (X ASC), organized under the umbrella of the Academician Council—an international consortium of scholars and researchers—was successfully hosted by the National Business School at TUF.

Themed “People, Planet, and Peace in the Age of AI,” the congress served as a global platform for academic and industry experts to exchange ideas and insights on the evolving role of artificial intelligence in shaping sustainable societies.

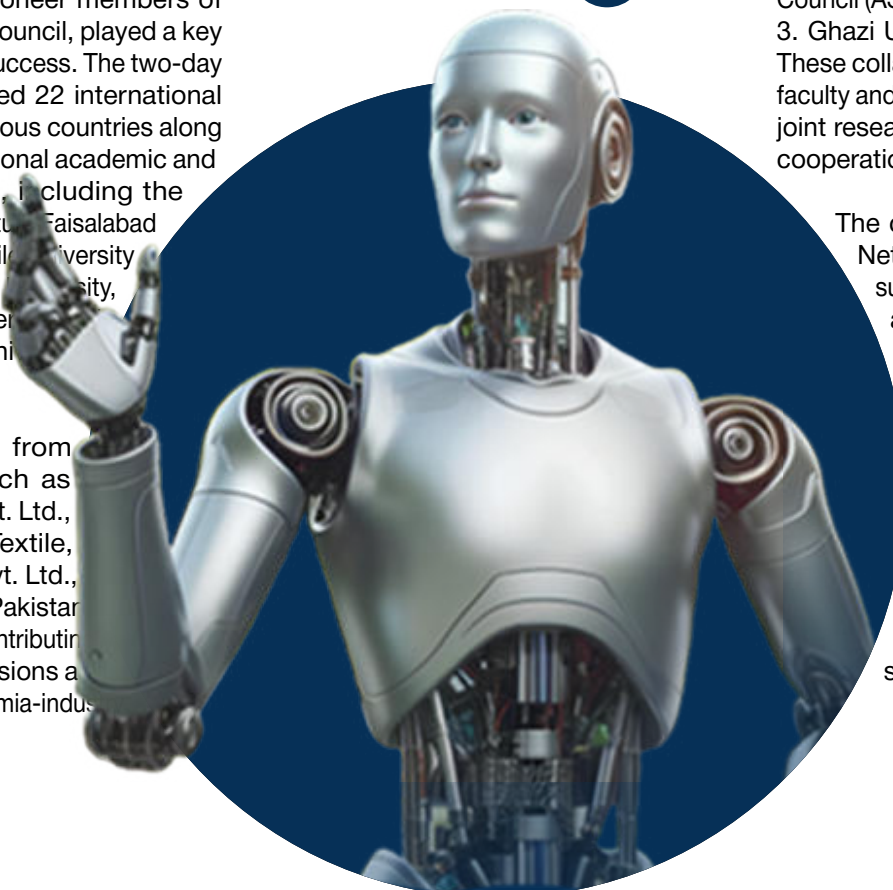
The event featured keynote speeches, academic paper presentations, and a panel discussion moderated by Mr. Sharjeel Yousaf (Lecturer, NBS), with distinguished panelists including Prof Dr Zulfiqar Ali (VC, UAF), Prof Dr Nadeem Bhatti (VC, Lahore Leads University), and Dr Habib Aslam Gaba (President, FCCI). The dialogue centered on leveraging AI for sustainable development and global peace.

Over 300 research papers were presented during the congress, with selected works under review for publication in Scopus-indexed journals.

A major highlight was the signing of three Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) between The University of Faisalabad and: 1. Academician Studies Council (ASC) 2. Lahore Leads University 3. Ghazi University, Dera Ghazi Khan. These collaborations aim to strengthen faculty and student exchange programs, joint research projects, and academic cooperation across institutions.

Fundamentals of Oncoplastic **BREAST SURGERY COURSE**



The Department of Breast Surgery at Madina Teaching Hospital, in collaboration with the Madina Breast Cancer Society, organized the “Fundamentals of Oncoplastic Breast Surgery Course” at the University Medical & Dental College, The University of Faisalabad, on October 6, 2025. This was the first hands-on course on oncoplastic fundamentals in Pakistan and successfully brought together 22 participants from 8 cities across the country.

This pioneering course aimed to equip trainees and junior consultants with essential skills in oncoplastic breast surgery, covering fundamental principles. The curriculum included a wide range of topics—from basic principles and markings to advanced techniques in oncoplastic breast surgery.

Prof Dr Saira Saleem, Head of the Department of Breast Surgery at Madina Teaching Hospital, served as the course

director and organizer. With UK-based training and pioneering experience in this innovative field in Pakistan, she led the course alongside a distinguished faculty. The teaching team included nationally and internationally renowned breast surgeons such as Ms Laura Arthur from Scotland, Dr Asad Parvez from Peterborough, UK, Dr Huma Majeed Khan (Head of the Breast Surgery Department at Ittefaq Hospital, Lahore), and Dr Erum Najeeb from PIMS. They shared advanced skills and strategies, enabling participants to enhance their surgical expertise.

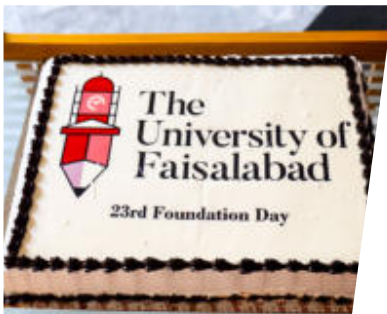

The hands-on training component of the course provided participants with the opportunity to practice and refine

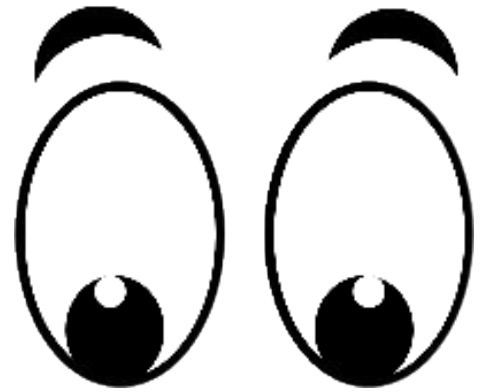

THE EVOLVING LANDSCAPE OF PRESBYOPIA MANAGEMENT



The Department of Optometry, TUF, in collaboration with the Department of Ophthalmology, Madina Teaching Hospital Faisalabad, successfully organized a Scientific Symposium on “Presbyopia: From Glasses to Drops – The Evolving Landscape of Presbyopia Management” on October 24, 2025. 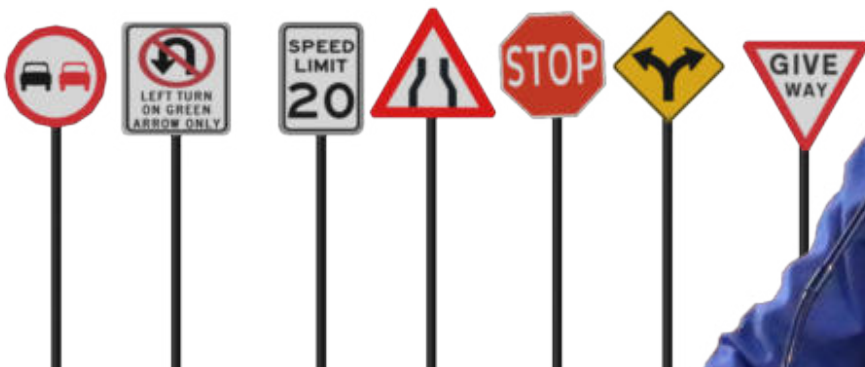

Awareness Seminar and Workshop

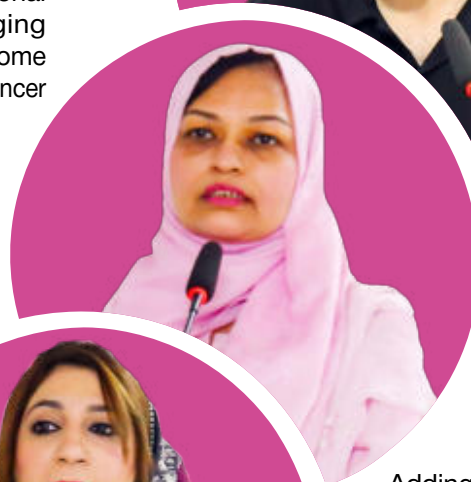

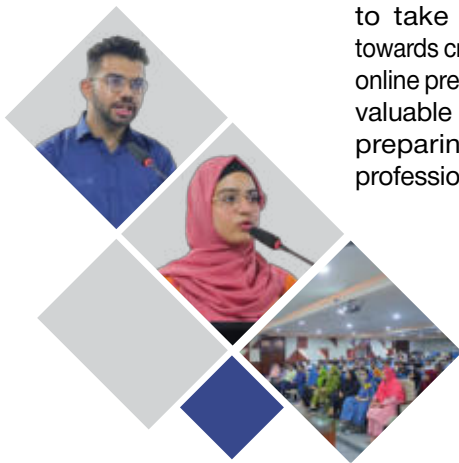
Enlightening Session on [Showcasing Yourself to the World](#) **STRENGTHENING DIGITAL PRESENCE THROUGH LINKEDIN**

WORLD ANESTHESIA DAY

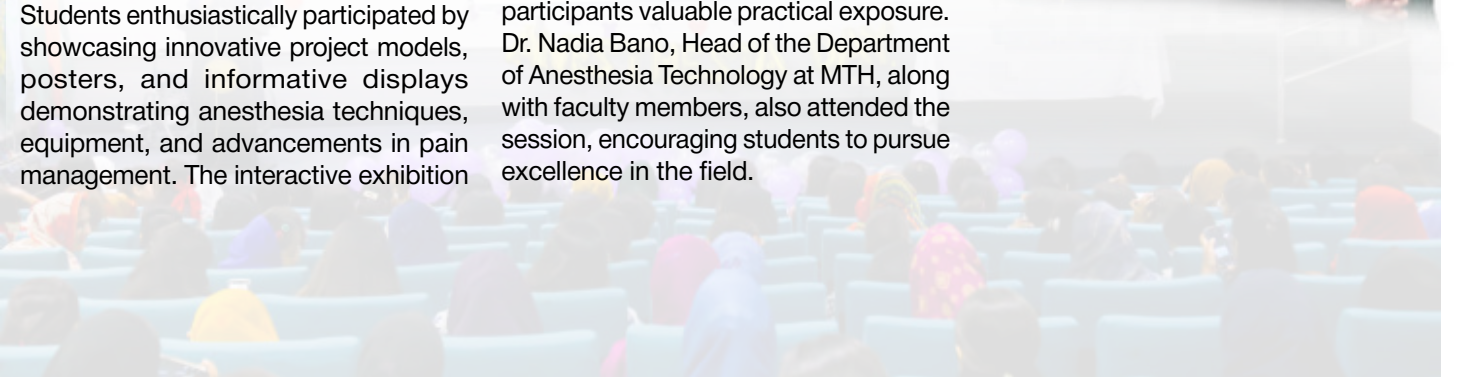
with Hands-On Workshop on Airway Management

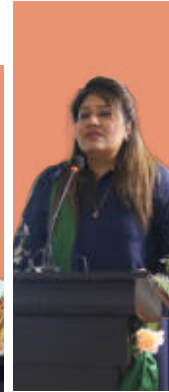
WORLD MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS DAY 2025

Celebrates Academic Excellence

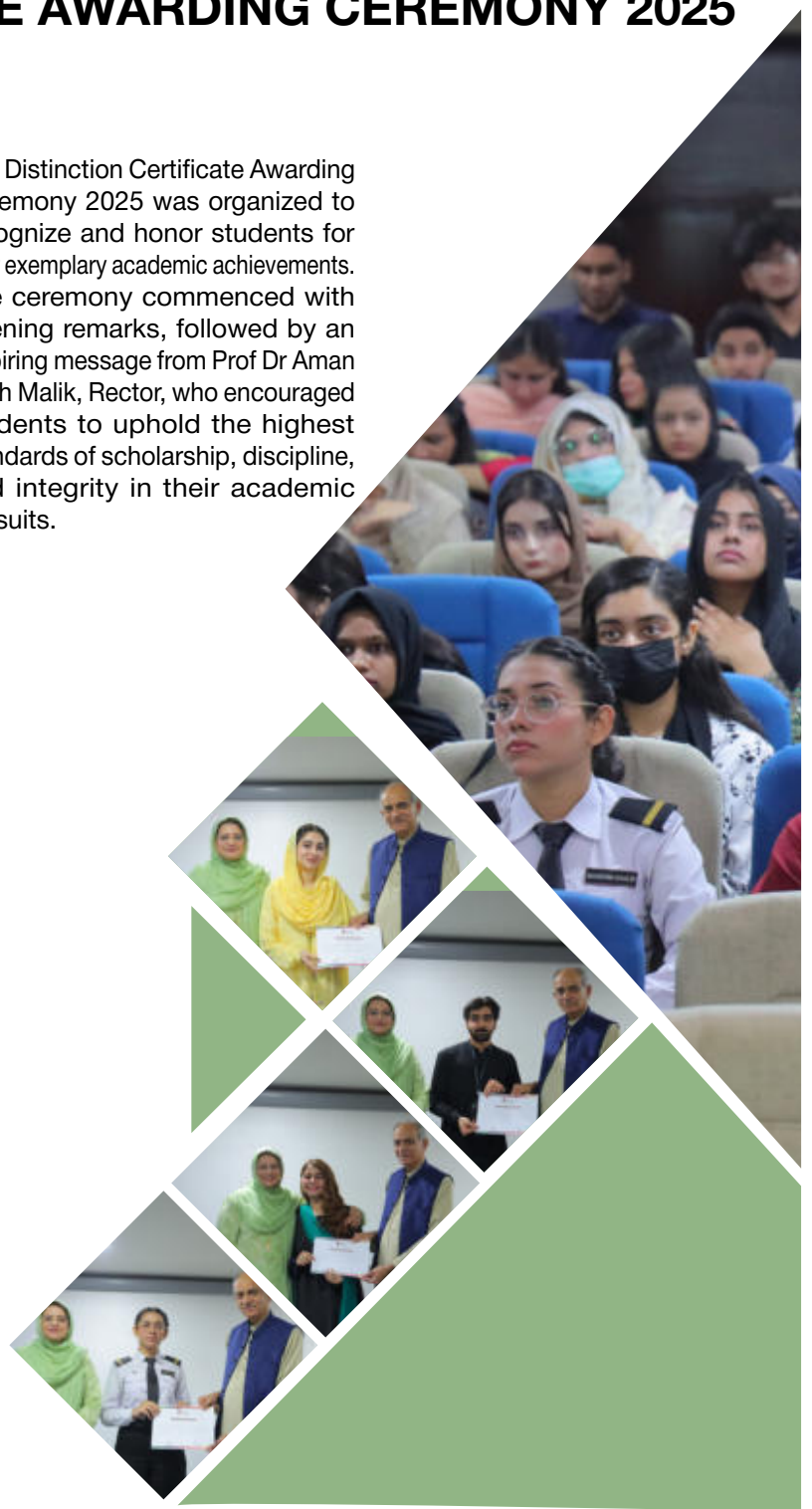

BONE MINERAL DENSITY CAMP PROMOTED

Bone Health Awareness



The Department of Rehabilitation Sciences at The University of Faisalabad organized a Bone Mineral Density (BMD) Camp on October 16, 2025, at the OPD Basement, New Building, Amin Campus. The camp aimed to promote awareness about bone health, facilitate early screening for bone density abnormalities, and encourage preventive healthcare practices among students, faculty, and staff. The event offered free Bone Mineral Density scans and consultation sessions focusing on

musculoskeletal health and lifestyle management to reduce the risk of osteoporosis and related conditions.

A total of 240 participants availed the screening services. Results showed that 57 participants had normal bone density, 168 were identified with osteopenia, and 15 were diagnosed with osteoporosis. These findings highlighted the growing importance of regular screening and awareness regarding bone health among adults. The camp received an overwhelming

response, with participants appreciating the Department's efforts to provide both a valuable health service and an educational opportunity within the university. The initiative also reflected TUF's ongoing commitment to community well-being and preventive healthcare. This activity contributed to the following Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): Good Health and Well-Being, Quality Education, and Partnerships for the Goals.

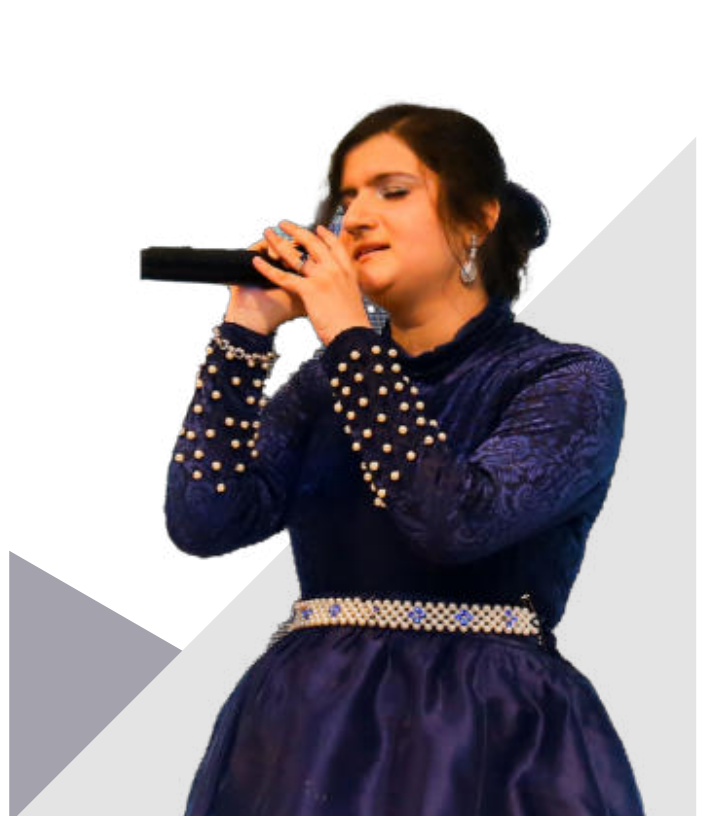

Dr Tahreem, PT, visited the students during the tour and elaborated on the various therapeutic techniques, equipment, and rehabilitation approaches used at the center, providing valuable guidance and professional insights into their practical applications. During the tour, students observed various rehabilitation and educational activities, interacted with special children, and learned about the multidisciplinary approaches used in therapy, including physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and speech therapy. The students also discussed behavioral interventions and community-based programs that play a vital role in promoting independence and inclusion.

This study tour supported the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals).

Students of Mass Communication and International Relations

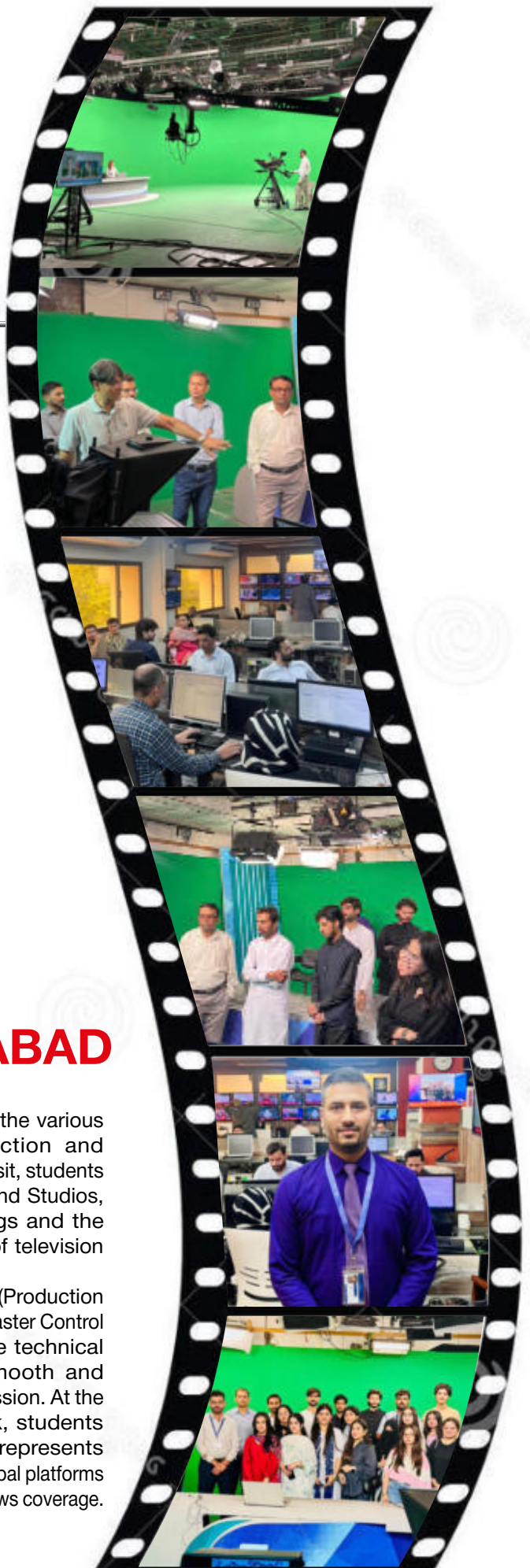
VISIT PTV NEWS HEADQUARTERS, ISLAMABAD

Ergonomics for the Cleaning Staff

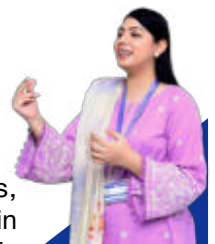

PEARL D' ETE



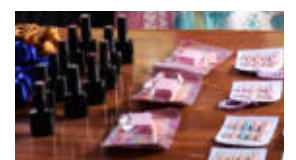

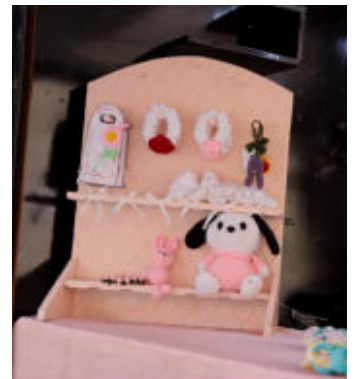
