Stories that Move and Motivate



To mark the International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) on 3 December 2025, TUF Rehabilitation Society hosted an uplifting event titled “Rehab Speaks 25: Stories that Move and Motivate.” The program celebrated advocacy, empowerment, and inclusion by showcasing the remarkable journeys of individuals who have excelled despite physical

challenges. Aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-Being), SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities), SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals), the event aimed to raise awareness of disability rights, inspire rehabilitation students, and highlight the transformative role of rehabilitation sciences in improving lives.

Three distinguished speakers shared powerful narratives of resilience:

Handball.” His journey underscored discipline, ambition, and breaking stereotypes, inspiring well-being through sports and empowerment.

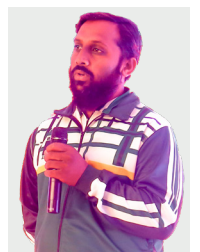
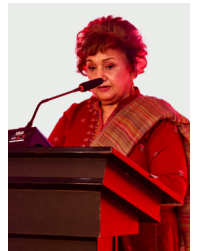

TUF'S BOARD OF ADVANCED STUDIES

& Research Convenes for Strategic **MEETING**

A meeting of Board of Advanced Studies and Research (BASR) held in Saleem Campus, presided by Prof Dr Aman Ullah Malik, Rector, TUF.

In line with its mission to steer the University's advanced studies, research and postgraduate supervision, the Board reviewed significant academic developments. Dr Zahida Maqbool, Registrar, presented progress updates and highlighted improvements since the last meeting.

Discussions centered on curriculum revisions, supervisory appointments, and academic policy enhancements in compliance with HEC standards. A major focus was the revision of Schemes of Studies for multiple degree programs, set to take effect from Fall 2026.

Key decisions included:

- Approval of TUF's Commercialization & Consultancy Policy
- Approval of revised Schemes of Studies for postgraduate programs
- Appointment of local and foreign examiners for thesis evaluation
- Introduction of a new online PhD thesis evaluation proforma
- Comprehensive review of faculty activities via the ERP system
- Standardization of formats for thesis writing and submission

The meeting concluded with appreciation for the faculty's collective efforts in strengthening academic quality and aligning programs with the University's vision and HEC requirements.

International Training Workshop on Business Process Simulation

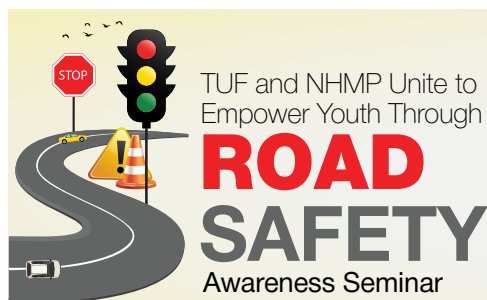

A specialized technical session was led by Rana Irfan Ahmed, Road Safety Officer, NHMP, who introduced students to the FLOWER Method—a comprehensive pre-journey protocol:

Fuel | Lights | Oil | Water | Electrics | Rubber (Tyres)

Beyond mechanical fitness, Officer Ahmed delved into the psychology of the road,

addressing the "Red Mist" (road rage) and the catastrophic consequences of mobile phone distractions. By citing the sobering reality of 1.19 million annual global road fatalities, he challenged the audience to adopt proactive speed management and mental discipline as a life-saving necessity.

Inspiring Civic Duty

The seminar also featured Ms Samina Sarwat, DSP, NHMP, and Ms Naseem Malik, Line Officer, NHMP, both of whom delivered stirring calls to action. They encouraged the student body to view road safety not merely as a set of rules, but as a profound civic duty to protect human life.

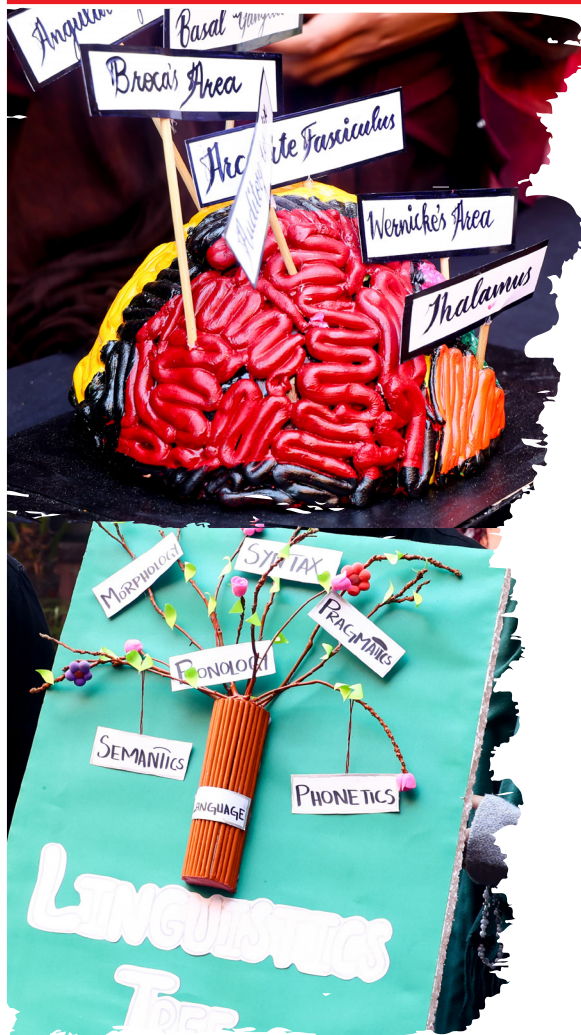
THE ART OF EXPRESSION

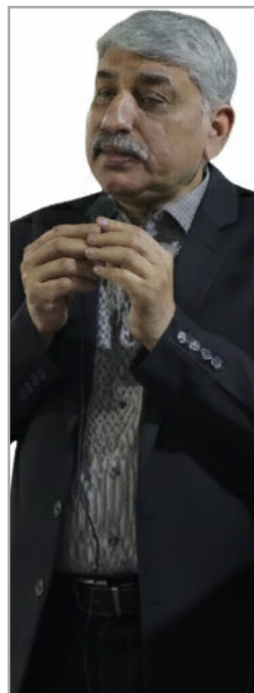

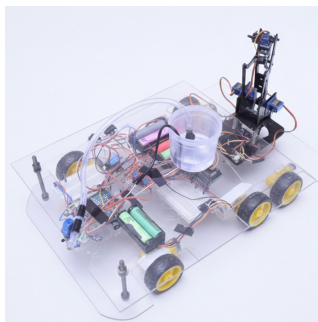

TUF AND HEC SHINE AT THE 35TH NATIONAL GAMES

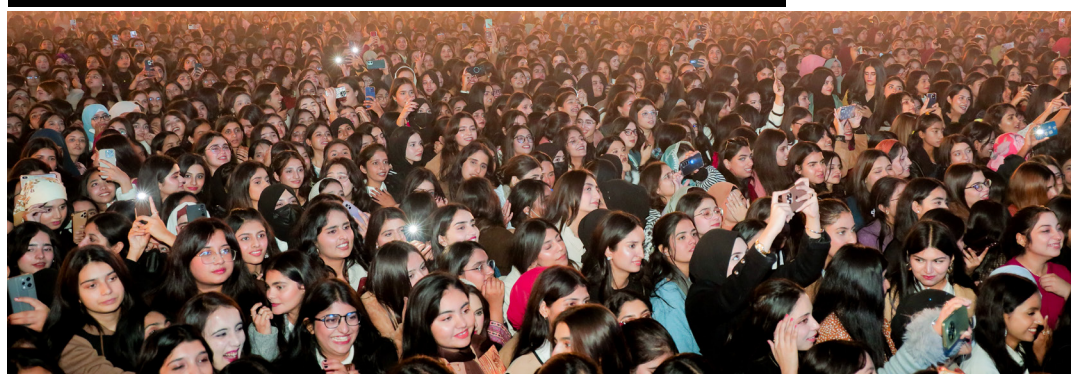

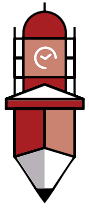
