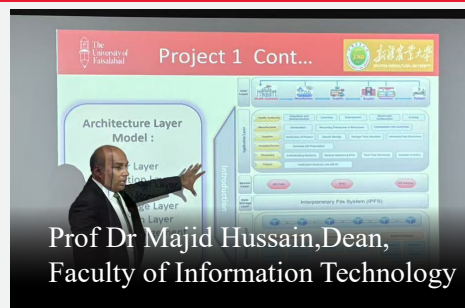

The Department of Gastroenterology at Madinah Teaching Hospital, in collaboration with UMDC Hepatitis Awareness Society and the Pakistan Society for the Study of Liver Diseases (PSSLD), enthusiastically observed World Hepatitis Day 2025 to raise awareness about the global burden of hepatitis and promote preventive measures.

Themed “Let’s Break It Down”, the event featured a series of impactful activities, including expert talks, competitions, and an awareness walk. Renowned medical professionals from MTH Dr Shahid Rasool, Dr Umair Shafqat, Dr Khalid Mehmood Yahya, Dr Muhammad Aslam, and Dr Ayman Rehman,

shared valuable insights on hepatitis prevention, diagnosis, and treatment. Guest Speakers highlighted that “Pakistan faces a significant burden of hepatitis, particularly hepatitis B and C (HBV/HCV), with an estimated 12 million people affected.

This high prevalence makes Pakistan a global hotspot for these viral infections. The country also experiences a high number of hepatitis-related deaths, with an estimated 20,000 people dying annually from hepatitis-related causes”.





An awareness walk was conducted within the hospital premises, led by devoted doctors and nursing staff, symbolizing solidarity and commitment to fighting hepatitis.

To engage students and promote health education, various competitions were organized, including a quiz competition, a poster competition, and a short video competition centered around the day's theme.

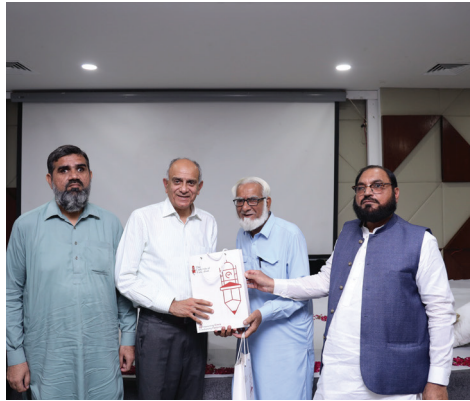
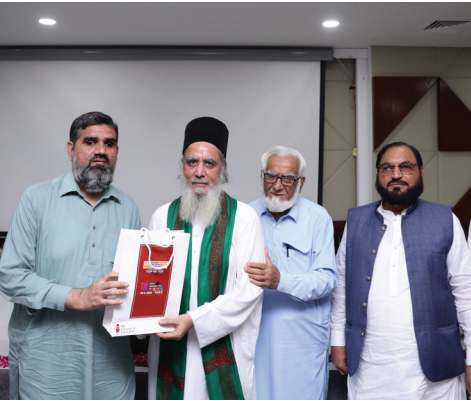
SUMMER COURSE ON WOUND MANAGEMENT

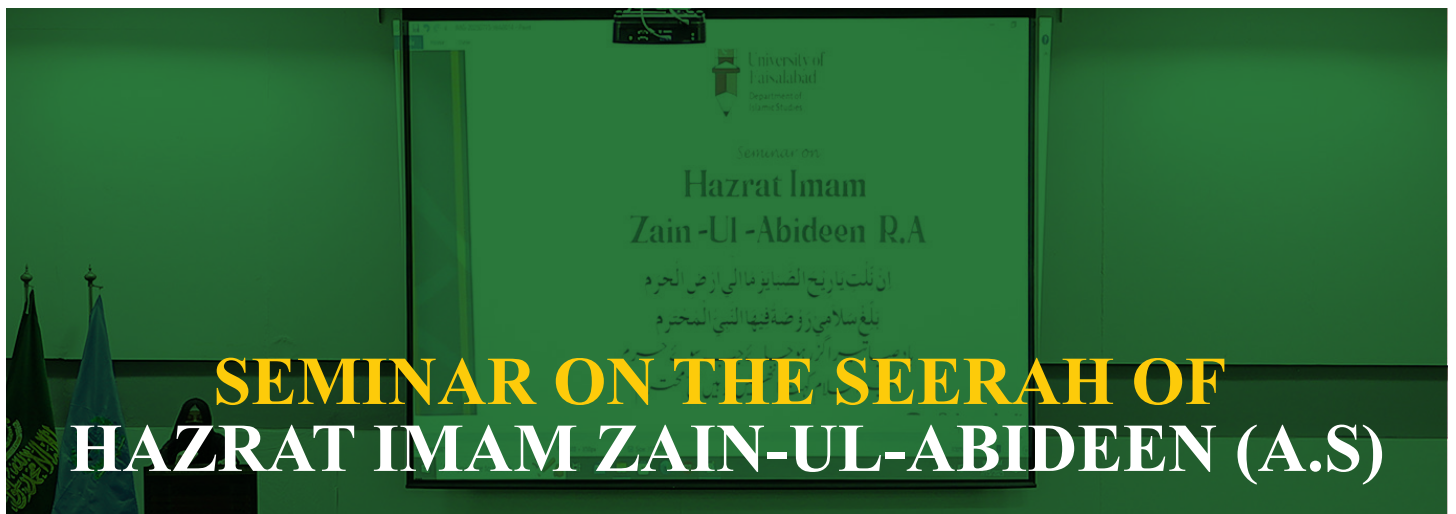
MEHFIL-E-MUSHAIRA MANAQAB-E-AHL-E- BAIT-E-ATHAAR (A.S)

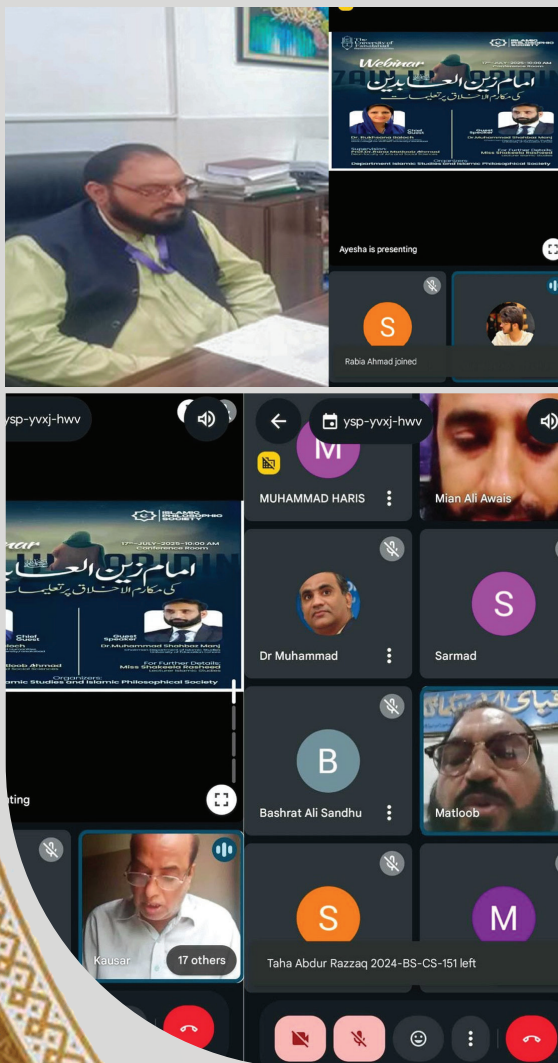

Webinar on the Moral Teachings and Legacy of Imam Zain ul Abideen (A.S)



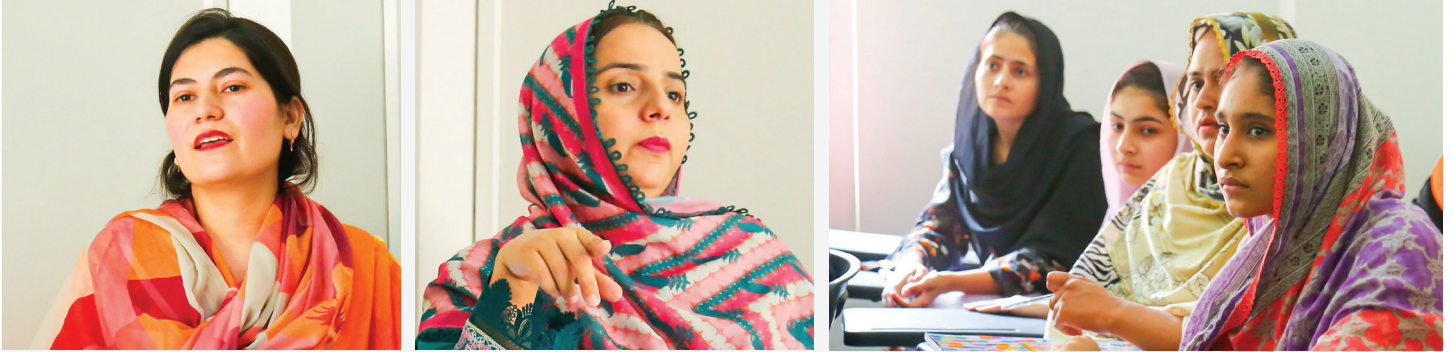

The initiative not only highlighted the university's dedication to promoting athletic excellence but also provided a valuable platform for young athletes to take the next step in their sporting journey within an academic setting

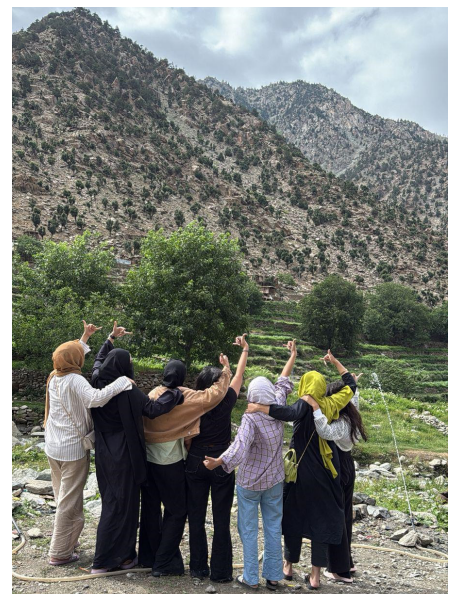
