3rd International Conference on Advanced STEAM Education (ICASE-2025) HELD AT TUF

The 3rd International Conference on Advanced STEAM Education (ICASE 2025), held in hybrid mode, brought together scholars, technologists, policymakers, and industry leaders from across the globe under the theme “Connecting Technology, Arts and Social Science for Shaping the Future.”

International Reach:

Delegates from 13 countries including USA, UK, China, Malaysia, UAE, Turkiye, Italy, and Saudi Arabia.

Organizations: 57 institutions participated (45 from Pakistan, 12 international).

Scientific Program:

- 222 presentations delivered (out of 247 submissions)
- 21 keynote addresses (12 national, 9 international)
- 25 invited talks (12 national, 13 international)
- 112 oral presentations (78 TUF, 34 external)
- 64 posters (55 TUF, 9 external)

Over 3,161 registrations, with 2,291 participants present across two days.

Digital Impact: Online reach exceeded 25 million views.

The inauguration began with the arrival of distinguished guests, including international speakers Prof Dr Dato' Narimah Samat, Universiti Sains Malaysia, and Prof Dr Asad Khattak, Zayed University, UAE. Senior leadership of TUF—Mr Muhammad Haider Amin, Chairman BOG; Dr Muhammad Hamza Amin, Vice Chairman BOG; Prof Dr Aman Ullah Malik, Rector; and Dr Zahida Maqbool, Registrar, warmly welcomed all delegates. Prof Dr Aman Ullah Malik, Rector TUF, officially inaugurated the conference with a welcoming address to national and international delegates and guests. This was followed by an insightful talk by Prof Dr Majid Hussain, Conference General Chair, titled “ICASE: Turning Vision into Reality”, emphasizing collaborative STEAM advancements.

Two major keynote addresses enriched the session, Prof Dr Dato' Narimah Samat presented “Bridging Disciplines, Shaping Future: Advancing STEAM Education for a Sustainable Tomorrow.”

Prof Dr Asad Khattak delivered insights on “AI Applications in Healthcare and Education.” The panel discussion on “Beyond Imagination: Shaping Tomorrow

with AI and STEAM,” comprised six distinguished experts: Prof Dr Mustafa Aslan from Bilgi University, Turkiye; Prof Dr Zhou Deyi from Huazhong University, China; Mr Wahaj Siraj, CEO of Nayatel, Pakistan; Prof Dr Ahmed Seffah from Zayed University, United Arab Emirates; Prof Dr Kamran Munir from the University of the West of England, England; and Prof Dr Nadeem Javed from the National Yunlin University of Science and Technology, Taiwan. The discussion explored human-centric AI, the integration of Arts & Social Sciences into STEM, and future innovation frameworks.

Addressing the gathering, His Excellency Mehmet Eymen Simsek expressed that “international collaboration is the foundation of meaningful educational progress.” Speaking on future academic directions, Prof Dr Iqbal Ahmad Khan highlighted that “Pakistan’s higher education sector must realign itself with emerging global technologies.”



In his chief guest remarks, Prof Dr Muhammad Iqbal Choudhary, Representing COMSTECH, emphasized that “the Islamic world stands at a critical moment where scientific advancement must be accelerated.” Closing the inaugural session, **Mr Muhammad Haider Amin, Chairman BOG, TUF**, acknowledged the global participation and stated,

“ICASE-2025 stands on the strength of its contributors—our distinguished speakers, delegates, and partners.” In a significant move to strengthen educational ties, The University of Faisalabad (TUF) signed Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) with key international partners during the event.





These agreements, aimed at promoting mutual educational cooperation, were finalized with: Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) and Selçuk University, Türkiye. Students from The University of Faisalabad displayed research projects and posters on a variety of subjects.

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The Soirée Night, organized as part of the STEAM Conference especially for the guests, added a festive and vibrant touch to ICASE 2025. This evening event was graced by prominent dignitaries who addressed the audience, including Dr Muhammad Hamza Amin, Vice Chairman BOG, TUF; Prof Dr Aman Ullah Malik, Rector, TUF; Prof Dr Kanwal Ameen, Vice

Chancellor, GCWUF; and Prof Dr Adnan Noor Mian, Vice Chancellor, Information Technology University. Their remarks highlighted the importance of global collaboration, interdisciplinary learning, and the role of STEAM education in shaping a progressive and innovative academic landscape.

i. The Computer Science sessions offered a dynamic, globally-focused look at the future of computing, spearheaded by eminent international experts. Keynote addresses by Prof Dr Kamran Munir (University of West England, UK) and Prof Dr Nadeem Javaid (National Yunlin University of Science & Technology, Taiwan) challenged delegates on the revolutionary potential of Data Science Without Borders and the true evolution of Agentic AI. The sessions showcased groundbreaking research in Artificial Intelligence, Multimodal Deep Learning, and Autonomous Systems, covering vital topics from deep learning

for disease detection to the development of cutting-edge Explainable AI (XAI) and Generative Security Frameworks.

ii. The NBS sessions stood out by linking business strategy directly to global sustainability and technology. Mr Wahaj Siraj (CEO Nayatel) highlighted the necessity of STEAM-led leadership in fostering corporate innovation and ethical accountability. International insights were key, with speakers like Prof Dr Zhou Deyi (China) discussing E-Commerce and agricultural entrepreneurship, and Prof Dr Mustafa Aslan (Türkiye) providing a cross-country perspective on Entrepreneurial Intention. Research presentations showcased cutting-edge work on circular economy adoption, sustainable marketing, fintech revolutions, and the vital role of Green HR strategies and digital platforms in empowering youth and ensuring food supply safety.



The Biochemistry & Biotechnology sessions highlighted crucial advancements in environmental and medical breakthroughs, underscoring the vital role of biotechnology in STEAM-driven solutions. The sessions featured impactful keynotes on low-cost floating treatment wetlands for wastewater reuse by Dr Muhammad Afzal (NIBGE) and biochemical profiling for biomarker discovery by Amjad Hameed. Researchers presented groundbreaking work on combating global issues, including using bacteria for microplastic

remediation, developing nanomaterial-based diagnostics for plant diseases, and advancing novel biomarker profiling for Alzheimer's disease, solidifying the department's commitment to sustainable healthcare and environmental engineering.

iv. The Radiography & Imaging Sciences session showcased the cutting-edge role of diagnostic imaging in public health and clinical decision-making. Chaired by Prof Dr Anjum Mehdi (Madina Teaching Hospital), the session featured a compelling keynote

by Dr Ahmad Mehmood Rana (University of Lahore) on using Triphasic CT for characterizing liver lesions in diabetic patients. Research highlighted impactful diagnostic applications, including the critical use of MRI for identifying lumbar disc herniation and the innovative combination of Laser-Induced Breakdown Spectroscopy with machine learning for rapid detection of female reproductive disorders, underscoring advancements in accurate and timely

medical diagnostics.

v. The Nutrition & Dietetics scientific session spotlighted innovative approaches to public health and transforming food systems. Chaired by Prof Dr Mahr un Nisa (GC University Faisalabad), the session featured a keynote by Mr Allah Rakha on "Transforming Pakistani Food Systems to Make them Healthy and Climate Resilient." Presentations covered crucial topics, including maternal and child nutrition, the link between diet and mental wellness, and the use of digital tools and AI to combat malnutrition and strengthen food systems through smart nutrition practices.

vi. The Mathematics, Physics, and Statistics session highlighted the crucial role of these disciplines in STEAM innovation. A keynote by Ahmad Zeeshan (IIUI) focused on a Secure Image Encryption Algorithm inspired by chaotic fluid dynamics. Other research showcased advanced applications, including a blockchain framework for securing Generative AI prompt data, fuzzy soft graphs for manufacturing optimization, and the use of mathematical fusion models for real-time predictive healthcare intelligence.

vii. The Pharmacy Sessions on Day 2 presented major pharmaceutical breakthroughs. Keynotes covered "Nano-Enabled Drug Delivery Systems for Cardiovascular Therapeutics" (Tanveer A. Tabish) and "Food Supplements for Gastrointestinal Health" (Hammad Ullah). Research highlighted nanoparticles, transdermal systems, natural extracts, wound-healing hydrogels, and

nutritional therapeutics, confirming a strong emphasis on modern, evidence-based clinical advancements.

viii. The Education Session, chaired by Prof Dr Shafqat Hussain, was a powerful showcase of research linking STEAM reforms, innovative pedagogy, and technology. The focus was on preparing students for global challenges by bridging research and practice, and emphasizing collaboration for a creative educational ecosystem.

ix. The English Language and Literature Sessions concentrated on the influence of Artificial Intelligence (AI) on both literature and language teaching. Keynotes included Prof Dr Sham Haider on argument construction and Prof Dr Muhammad Asim Mehmood presenting an Automated Writing Evaluation Tool for ESL. Research spanned AI's role in media and academic reading, alongside diverse literary and linguistic studies such as posthumanism, trauma-informed analysis, and sociolinguistics on Pakistani campuses.

x. The Dermal Science Session at the Scientific Sessions, chaired by Dr Musarrat UI Hassnain, focused on innovative educational pedagogy in medical fields. Key presentations included Prof Dr Shirza Nadeem comparing team-based learning with traditional lectures in forensic medicine, Dr Noor-i-Kiran mapping digital resilience among medical students, and Dr Komal Atta introducing a Gamification-Driven Pedagogical Model for dental education. The session concluded with a panel discussion on "Bridging generations in

education: Pedagogy for Gen Z and Beyond.

xi. The Rehabilitation Sciences Session, chaired by Prof Dr Salman Bashir, focused on "Humanizing Technology" in physical therapy, keynoted by Rabiya Noor. Research showcased clinical trials on burn contracture flexibility and pulsed magnetic field effects. Comparative studies examined Buerger's Therapy vs. Manual Lymphatic Drainage and Virtual Reality vs. Mirror Therapy for conditions like phantom neuralgia, alongside work on workstation ergonomics and VR for children with ASD.

xii. The Optometry Session focused on paediatric eye care technology and myopia control. Keynotes were delivered by Don Lyon (Indiana University, USA) on the "Latest technologies in Paediatric Eye care" and Eman Alzghoul (Jordan University of Science) on "Advancing Myopia Control through Technology and Education." Research presented covered a STEAM Framework for retinal innovation, the impact of blue light exposure, and the use of Vision Pro Glasses for low vision. The ICASE-2025 conference concluded as a resounding success, unifying diverse disciplines under Advanced STEAM Education to drive technological innovation and pedagogical reforms for a future-ready and ethically grounded world.



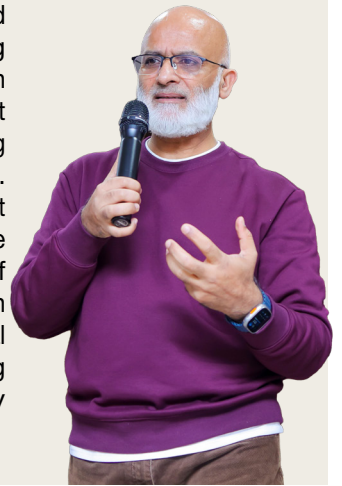
ICASE-2025 PRE-CONFERENCE WORKSHOP

algorithmic simulation crafted by complex deep learning architectures. The interaction highlighted the need for robust ethical frameworks governing autonomous medical systems. This successful and high-impact seminar was a collaborative effort between the Office of the Dean of Clinical Research and the Department of Dermal Sciences, perfectly aligning with the interdisciplinary mission of ICASE-2025.

Adding brilliance to the occasion, four distinguished speakers from diverse professional backgrounds took the stage to share their transformative journeys and ideas worth spreading:

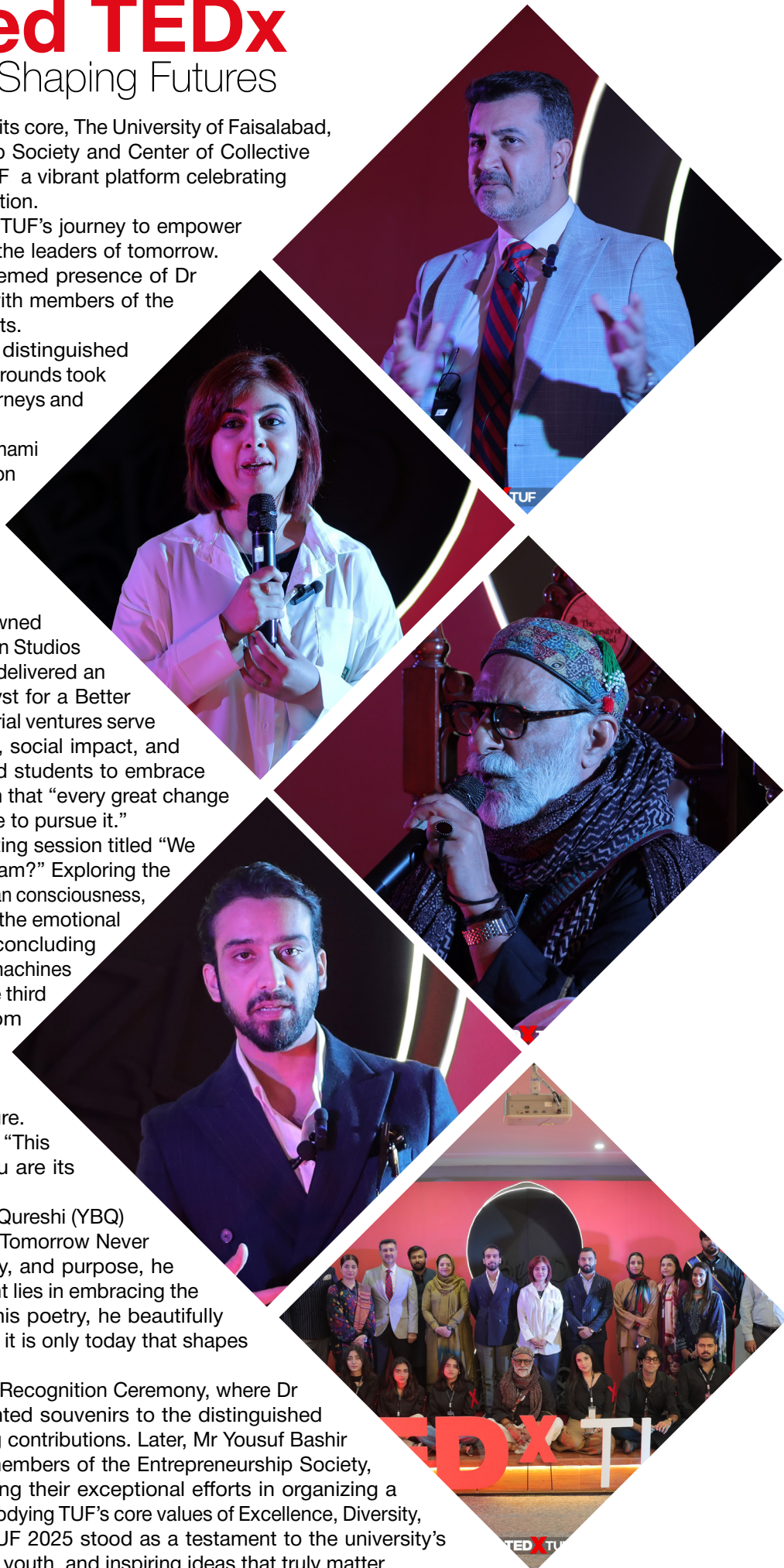
- Mr Asmat Ullah Khan, Founder & CEO, Amami Clothing Pvt. Ltd. and Chinar Lube Station

TUF, Prof Dr Akram Malik, Principal UMDC and Prof Dr Tanzeela Khalid, Dean Clinical Research.

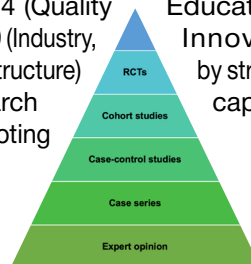


Two-Day Applied Statistics Workshop Equips Participants for CROSS-SECTIONAL STUDIES AND RCTS

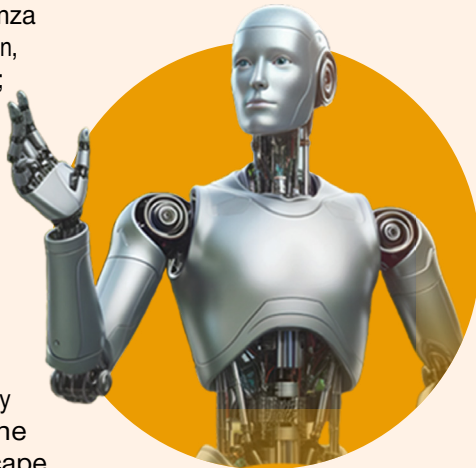


Visionary Session on EXPLORING THE FUTURE OF WORK AND INNOVATION” WITH SALIM GHARI

Digital Revolution: Dental Sciences Seminar Focuses on **INTEGRATING TECHNOLOGY IN ORAL HEALTH**

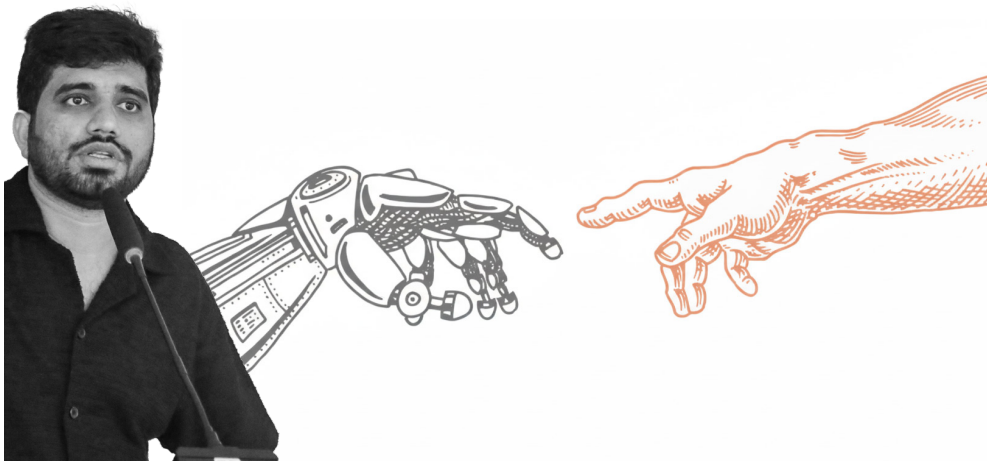

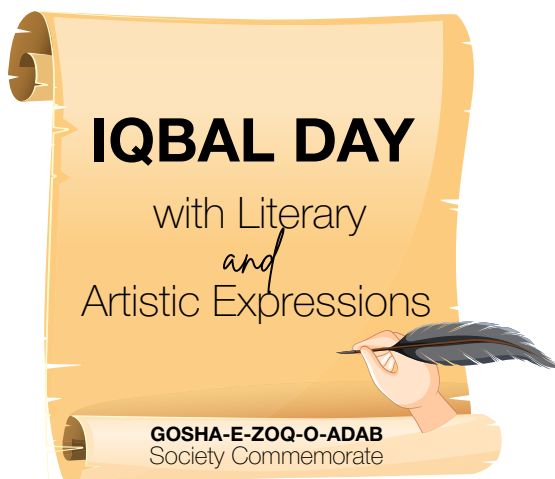

wisdom and thought-provoking philosophy. The audience was left deeply inspired by his eloquent words and unique perspective, making the session a memorable and enriching experience for all participants.

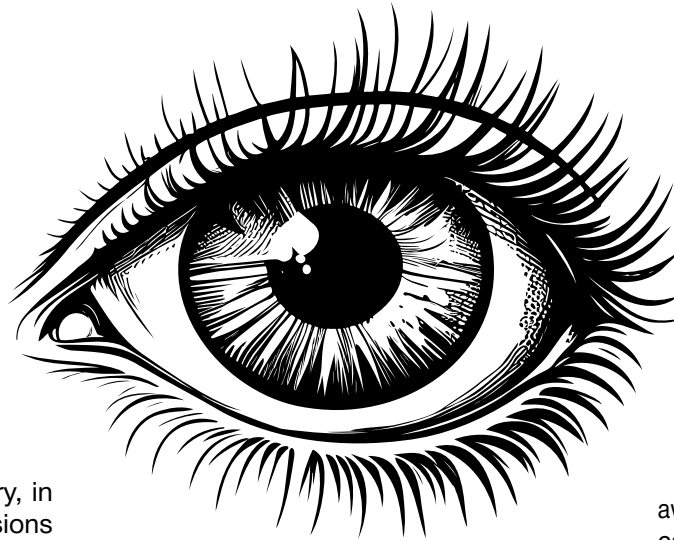

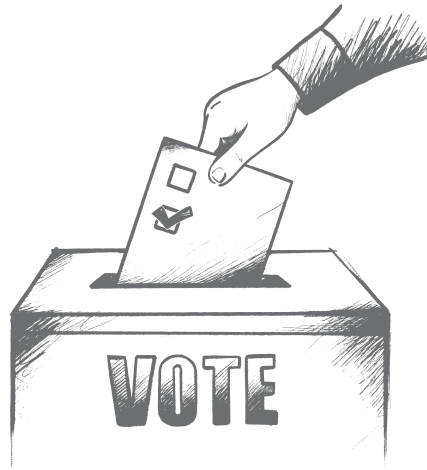

The election process served as a powerful reminder that effective leadership begins

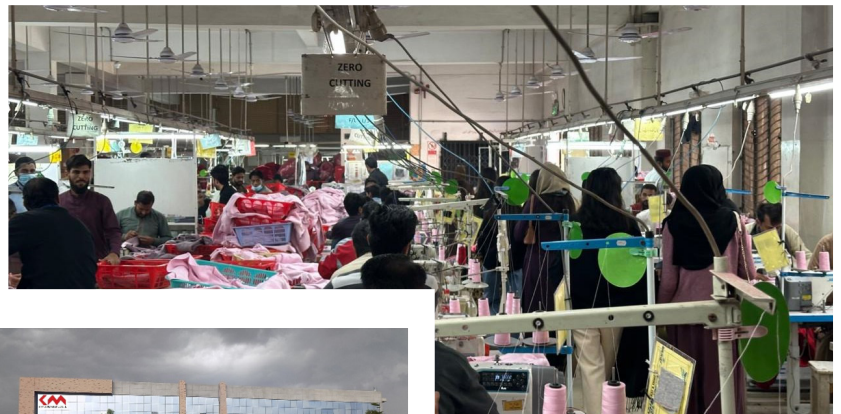

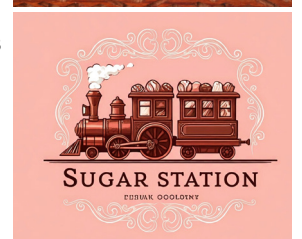

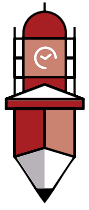
