This 3-day workshop, part of the Accelerated Clinical Learning Series by distinguished International Experts from South Korea included Prof Dr Moon-Kyu Lee, Associate Professor, Chosun University, Ms Hye-Ryoung Park, CEO, The Lab Friends Pilates Lab, Ms Ae-Ji Kim, Director of Research, Korea PNF Association, Namal Zafar, Interpreter from Korean Embassy.

The final day focused on integrating these learned synergies into individualized rehabilitation programs, emphasizing practical execution and personalized planning. Participants engaged in group discussions to solidify their understanding

TUF Rehabilitation Society commemorated World Physical Therapy Day with a dedicated community outreach initiative at Old Age Home Aafiyat, Faisalabad, aligning with this year's global theme: "The Role of Physical Therapy and Physical Activity in Healthy Aging, with a Focus on Preventing Frailty and Falls." Recognizing the vital role of physiotherapy in enhancing independence and quality of life among older adults, the team organized a comprehensive assessment and awareness campaign that engaged 24 senior residents.

The campaign featured essential health screenings, including pulse monitoring and blood pressure assessments, to support early detection and proactive health management. Balance evaluations were conducted using the Y-Balance Test, revealing that 6 individuals scored ≤50%,

and 18 scored ≤85% or exactly 85% results indicating varying degrees of coordination imbalance and potential fall risk. Frailty assessments, carried out using the FRAIL Scale, identified 8 individuals as non-frail, 10 as pre-frail, and 6 as frail, providing a foundation for early, targeted interventions to promote resilience and mobility.

The day also included a seminar featuring distinguished guest speakers, including Dr Subhan Rasheed (CEO & Physiotherapist Consultant, Physio Med – Rehab & Medical Complex) and Dr Kinza Idrees (CEO & Physiotherapist Consultant, Care 360), both proud alumni of TUF. They shared their professional journeys, highlighted advancements in physiotherapy practices, and discussed the transformative impact of rehabilitation techniques in enhancing quality of life for patients.


The Painting Competition encouraged students to express their interpretations of peace, harmony, and unity through art.


