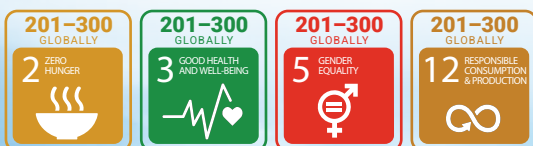

The recognition ceremony was held at the Centre of Excellence in Molecular Biology, Punjab University, bringing together leading researchers and scientists from across Pakistan. TUF faculty members

recognized on this prestigious global list include Prof Dr Zahir Ahmad Zahir, Director, ORIC, TUF; Prof Dr Aaqib Majeed, Associate Professor, Department of Mathematics, Physics and Statistics; and Dr Muhammad Jawad, Lecturer, Department of Mathematics, Physics and Statistics. 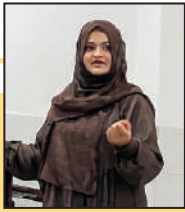
RESEARCH PROJECT VIVA EXAMINATION for First Pioneer Batch of Faculty of LAW
